Financial Report for RhetCanada 2023 AGM

Kyle Gerber served his first year as secretary treasurer (2-year term).

Revenues 2022-2023

- RhetCanada had \$4429.81 in revenues and \$1131.75 in expenses for a net gain of \$3298.06 in 2022-2023
- CSSR continues to collect EBSCO royalties for *Rhetor* access through EBSCO databases. In the past year we deposited \$215.96 in royalties, and are currently working with EBSCO to streamline payment process through direct deposit we anticipate depositing at least an additional \$660.65 USD in royalties generated up March 2023.
- The RhetCanada president transferred \$4218.35 from PayPal Memberships to the CSSR account in May 2023. This amount included membership payments made prior to 6 June 2022 (\$2621.02), and membership payments made up to 15 May 2023 (\$1592.83).

Expenses 2022-2023

- RhetCanada wrote a cheque to Bruce Dadey to reimburse him for the 2023 CFHSS membership fee of \$477.30.
- RhetCanada's banking fees continued at \$4.95/month for a total of \$54.45 (the fee for May 2023 was not issued at the time of this report).
- RhetCanada paid out \$600 in prizes for student papers given at the 2022 Conference.
